Mr. Hormats served as Assistant Secretary of State for Economic and Business Affairs, Ambassador and Deputy U.S. Trade Representative, and as Senior Deputy Assistant Secretary for Economic and Business Affairs at the Department of State. He also served as a senior staff member for International Economic Affairs on the National Security Council. Mr. Hormats is a member of the Board of Visitors of the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy and the Dean's Council of the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. Additionally, he is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and a board member of the Irvington Institute for Immunological Research and of Engelhard Hanovia, Inc. Mr. Hormats is the author of three books and has contributed to major news and business magazines in the U.S. and abroad. He is a recipient of the French Legion of Honor and the Arthur Fleming Award.

David A. Jones co-founded Humana Inc. and served as chief executive officer for 37 years and board chair for 44 years prior to retiring in 2005. Mr. Jones is currently nonexecutive chairman of the board of Hospira, a director of Glenview Trust Co. and a retired director of Abbott Laboratories and several other companies. Mr. Jones was a member of The Business Roundtable and co-founder and past chair of the Healthcare Leadership Council, a group of about 50 CEO's of the nation's largest healthcare organizations. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Louisville in 1954. He also became a Certified Public Accountant that same year. After three years of Navy service, he entered Yale University, earning a law degree (JD), while also serving on the economics faculty. He holds honorary doctorates from The Chicago Medical School, the University of Louisville, Transylvania University and the Claremont Graduate School. Mr. Jones served as the founding chairman of the Peter F. Drucker Graduate Management Center's Board of Visitors, Claremont Graduate School, California.

Robert G. Mr. Scott is a trustee of Williams College and served as a member of the Advisory Council of the Stanford University Graduate School of Business. He was also the co-chair of the 2003 U.S. Japan Private Sector/Government Commission and is a board member of the Japan Society. Mr. Scott is a director or Archipelago Inc., a member of the Board of Trustees of the New York Presbyterian Hospital, chairman of the American Museum of Fly Fishing and executive vice president of the Greater New York Council of the Boy Scouts of America. He received his bachelor's degree in Economics from Williams College and MBA from the Stanford University Graduate School of Business.
